Note

- 1. The highest January rainfall in the last 20 years was in 2014 with 243mm whilst the lowest was in 2006 with 36mm
- This year's February rainfall is a record for the last 20 years, the previous highest having been in 2014 when we had 233mm just beating 2002's 231mm! The lowest rainfall in February in the last 20 years was in 2003 when we had only 57mm.
- 3. The Met Office reported February as the wettest since their records began with a reading of 202.1mm so clearly East Anstey has had more than its fair share!
