Editorial by a member of the Ministry team

Change

We have landscapers in! Our back garden has been changing from what appeared to be quite small, with high, overgrown hedges, to what is currently, at halfway through, a wide expanse with nothing separating us from the farmer's field, and a view of the fields behind us. A patio and raised beds will emerge in time. We are really looking forward to it being completed – but a garden is never finished, is it? And there is all the mud and mess as everything changes.

We're not all very good at change, are we? As things in the country and North Devon settle into a new normal – as I write this we are still expecting all restrictions to be lifted on 19th July -we want some things to go back to being 'as they have always been', and yet others we are happier with what they have become. We are going to be more responsible for our own behaviour and choices. I think we will see masks worn by many for a time to come, even if we are allowed to sing in our churches again.

We tend to forget that change is a natural part of life – as our bodies age, we are 'still the same inside' – we don't notice that we are not 14, or 41, or whatever until we try to do something which once came easily – and can't reach, or run out of energy, or our fingers don't work like they used to.

And change happens in church life. This magazine is full of the awareness growing in our villages that the Reverend David Baker has been appointed to be the next Priest in Braunton. What a change for him – going from being responsible for 11 parishes to one! There will be a chance for David to write the letter for the next issue of the magazine – he is currently away, though coming to the end of his sabbatical. It is no secret, either, that Alastair is also due to leave us before the end of the year, having delayed his departure by a year. Chris Whinney has also surrendered his PTO (Permission to Officiate), which means he will no longer be leading many acts of worship for us. There will be opportunities for farewells – please look out for dates on the website or in church notices.

This means our ministry team will be quite small, and new patterns will have to be considered. Churchwardens will take on new responsibilities;

others will have to 'step-up'. New gifts will be discerned and developed. It will be the responsibility of the Rural Dean, in consultation with others, to ensure worship will be able to happen. Penny and Alison, neither of whom is full-time, will not automatically have the right to make decisions and change things.

But change does not always have to be negative. The seasons roll round – and we know that, as the poet Shelley said in Ode to the West Wind "... if winter comes, can spring be far behind?" From change and growth come the fruits and flowers – which takes us back to gardens. The soft fruits



have been producing well; the tomatoes etc are in flower. Change is necessary to provide that fruit. We look forward to new beginnings, because, although it is not helpful always to take bible verses out of context, the prophet Jeremiah said

"'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'" Jeremiah 29:11

NEWS FROM THE VILLAGES

KNOWSTONE -Michele Browse

As we await the final decision on the next stage of the Covid roadmap, we can look forward to further restrictions being lifted, allowing us even more freedom to meet, worship and attend events in our communities. St Peter's Church is offering two services a month (a Holy Communion service and a Morning Prayer service). Times may vary, so please check the church noticeboard or church door for updated timetables or refer to the Edgemoor Group website. In the month of August, services will be held on 8th August at 10.00am (Holy Communion) and 22nd August at 10.00am (Morning Prayer). A new timetable for services from September onwards should be available soon.

We also have just learned that Revd. David Baker, Team Rector, will be moving to Braunton, so church services may alter over the next few months until the Edgemoor Group fills this ministry role. With 11 churches in the group, it is sometimes a challenging job to provide church services more often throughout the various parishes, but everyone is welcome to attend St Peter's, including anyone whose own monthly church services may alternate with Knowstone Parish. We are all part of one big Christian family after all!

The concluding part of the extensive restoration work in the church – refurbishing and reinstalling the choir stall panelling near the rood steps – has now been completed, and the church once again is displaying its original, splendid appearance. The ongoing maintenance of St Peter's churchyard has been generally welcomed enthusiastically by members of this parish and visitors to our church, especially those visiting relatives' grave sites, who have not been to Knowstone for several years. However, anyone who wishes to take issue with any aspect regarding upkeep of the building and grounds are welcome to put this in writing to the PCC. It is unacceptable for anyone other than the PCC to post notices on church property (including the church gates).

On Saturday 26th June, the first Coffee Morning of 2021 was held in the Village Hall car park, with an attendance of more than 35 local residents. Following on from this successful "first event", a second Coffee Morning is planned for 31st July, hopefully with more to follow in future. Further

events in the Hall will be coming up, so keep checking noticeboards, the Knowstone website or the Knowstone Group Facebook page for updated details

Finally, the Exe Valley Market Bus is hoping to resume service in August – after 18 long months in lockdown! Feedback from regular passengers has indicated a real desire to see our community bus back in service, and it is hoped that we can maintain financially viable transport through consistent support from local residents. This service will continue to run each Thursday morning, with one trip a month to Barnstaple and the other weeks to South Molton. At this time, we are looking for extra drivers who would be willing to volunteer one morning a month (maximum) to drive this community minibus for Knowstone routes. We thank God we have come through this past year-and-a-half with continued resilience and cheerful spirit. We think of those we have lost and hold fast to the friendships we've grown and maintained. And we look ahead to good times with renewed hope.

News from the Exmoor Pony Centre, Ashwick, Dulverton TA22 9QE

We are looking forward to a busy Summer - the diary is filling up quickly with all-our riding sessions, so if you are wanting to ride, make sure you call the office to book in advance. It is also necessary to book in all visits to the centre to avoid disappointment on the day if we are at full capacity. Our stable yard tours proved so popular last year that we are continuing to run them this season.

At the beginning of June, six of our ponies made a very special trip to Sussex to partake in some filming. It is all top secret at the moment, but we will be able to fill you in at a later date. All the ponies were beautifully behaved, and the filming only needed one take! We always knew our ponies are pros. They stayed overnight and travelled home in a luxury airconditioned lorry, returning to their day jobs as if nothing had happened.

Those who have visited the centre may have met Walnut, a sweet natured 14-year-old gelding – he has now gone off to a foster home and is very happy living with his new Welsh pony friend. We hope this will be his forever home after a varied life thus far of companionship to other horses as well as conservation grazing. Amethyst and Buffy, a couple of friendly mares, have returned from their grazing and are now here at the Centre to continue their training and meet the visitors. Amethyst is the older of the two, who we hope to train as riding ponies in the future. They have joined our mis-match herd of other mares, a gelding and an honorary Exmoor owned by the manager.

An update on the lovely Myrica and her young son Elmo who came to stay with us through the winter, needing a little more shelter and grass than the moor could offer them to help them survive the cold. Elmo has now been castrated and is continuing his training with us. He will be in residence for the summer months to greet visitors. Myrica, his mother, has now returned to join the other Exmoors on North Hill, just above Minehead.

We are excited to reveal that our onsite shop has had a facelift this spring to make it covid safe for all and display some of the new lines we are stocking. One of which, we are very pleased to say, is 'Wild Pony Punch' coffee from the Exmoor Coffee Company (exmoorcoffee.co.uk). They are very kindly donating 50p back to us from every bag that WE sell. If you haven't popped up to see us recently now is a great time to have a look in our shop and to see the ponies.
